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"How To Release The Grace Of God To Others"

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"Wherefore we receiving a Kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and Godly fear." {Hebrews 12:28}

In our last lesson concerning God's Grace, we will clearly see that the Kingdom of God is governed and activated by the Grace of God. The Grace of God has transformed us out of the kingdom of darkness into the Kingdom of the Son of God; and we have been commissioned by the power of the Holy Spirit to release that Grace to others who will also be born from above and transformed by the Grace of God.

Let's review several of the revelations that we have learned from this series:

**The Divine Grace of God is the sovereign saving favor of God bestowed upon those who don't deserve it, and for which no payment, works, or compensation is demanded from the recipient. {Romans 11:6; Ephesians 2:8-9}

**The three characteristics of Divine Grace are: (A) It was planned and purposed before the world began. {Il Timothy 1:9}; (B) It cannot be earned, because it is free. {Romans 3:24}; (C) It reigns over sin, when believed and freely accepted. {Romans 5:21}

**The four enemies that hinder the believer in walking in the fullness of the Grace of God are: (A) <u>Legalism</u> - <u>Ephesians 2:10</u>; (B) <u>Pride</u> - <u>I Peter 5:5</u>; (C) <u>Jealousy</u> - <u>Song of Solomon 8:6</u>; (D) <u>Murmuring and Complaining</u> - <u>I Corinthians 10:10-12</u>.

**God releases His mercy in order to comfort us so that we can release that same comfort to others. It is not just for us, it is a continual outpouring to others. {II Corinthians 1:3-4}

The Hebrew word most often translated "grace" in the King James Version is Strong's #2580 - **Chen: graciousness, kindness, favor. In the Brown-Driver-Briggs Hebrew Lexicon, its meaning is given as "favor, grace, charm. In the New American Standard Dictionary, the Hebrew word Chen is defined as coming from the root **chanan**, Strong's #2603, which is to show favor, or to be gracious. In most cases in the Old Testament, the context shows us it is used in a manner implying the showing of favor.

In the New Testament, the English word translated from the Greek word **charis, Strong's #5485 and is defined as "graciousness of manner or act; especially the divine influence upon the heart, and its reflection in life; including gratitude."

**Thayer's Greek Dictionary brings out even more shades of meaning. It says grace is: "what affords joy, pleasure, delight, sweetness, charm, loveliness; grace is good will, loving-kindness, favor; grace is used of the merciful kindness by which God, exerting His holy influence upon souls, turns them to Christ, keeps, strengthens, increases them in Christian faith, knowledge, affection, and kindles them to the exercise of the Christian virtues."

**We should pray for God to give us an understanding of the grace and mercy of God; and should always be ready to release this grace and mercy to others. Our prayer should also include being delivered from the religious spirit, in order to extend to others the loving kindness that God has bestowed on us. We are not where we are today because we deserved it or earned it; it is only because of the Grace and Mercy of God that we are able to acknowledge that "we were lost, but now are found; we were blind, but now we see."

**One of the reasons it is so important for us to understand the sufficiency of the grace of God in the last of the last days is that we also are going to experience some of the same attacks that came against the Apostle Paul; and it is imperative that we understand how to stand and remain steadfast. This study will give clarity to some of the things that you have already gone through; and will empower you to be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of God.

- **Great Grace equips us with great power to be a witness of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.
- **Great Grace removes our focus from being on ourselves only, and places our focus on others and how we can impact their lives with the gospel of the Kingdom.
- **Great Grace takes us beyond our natural human ability, and empowers us with the ability of God to carry out His purpose.
- **Great Grace places upon us the favor and blessing of God that allows us to do far beyond our natural ability in advancing the Kingdom of God.
- **Great Grace propels us beyond natural circumstances and situations, and enables us to do supernatural exploits in the Name of Jesus.
- **Great Grace has the ability to remove the spirit of error and deception that attempts to enter our lives; and lead us by the spirit of truth and true revelation imparted by the Holy Spirit.
- **Before the very throne of God we have been given total and complete access to our Heavenly Father without guilt, condemnation, unworthiness, fear, or intimidation; not because of what we have done but because of what Jesus has done on our behalf.
- **At the throne of God, there is an impartation of His beholding us and testing every part of our lives; not to judge or condemn us but to aid, assist, and transform us into His image and likeness.
- **At the throne of God, there is a place reserved for those who allow the grace of God to help them overcome being lukewarm, void of passion, losing their zeal and fire for God.
- **At the throne of God there is a releasing of worship, adoration, praise, and honor unto God that transcends human comprehension and natural understanding.

**It is only by The Spirit of Life in Christ Jesus that we are able to live as "More than Conquerors" as clearly identified in the 8th chapter of Romans. God's Grace has everything to do with:

- A. Our position in Him.
- B. Our relationship with Him
- C. Our standing before Him
- D. Our identity as New Creations in Him

**Grace that breaks the dominion of sin is not a one time impartation, but rather an ongoing demonstration of God's power in our lives. True grace is not about us; it is all about God. True grace is not about what we have done; but what Jesus has done on our behalf. True Grace is not attempting to conform to man's opinion of me; but rather being transformed by the renewing of my mind concerning the Grace that God has freely given me.

**Just how do I live my life that attracts the Grace of God? I attract Grace as a "true friend" by settling in my heart that I need Grace for everything no matter how large or small; making it a daily habit to seek the assistance of Grace in everything that I do. The throne of Grace (Hebrews 4:16) is not just available in the impossible situation, but is available in every situation.

**Our daily bread and sustenance should be fellowshipping and communing with the Grace of God; God's Grace will sustain and empower us in the midst of every attack, persecution, betrayal, and any attempt that the enemy launches in his effort to destroy or hinder us.

**We can only release to others what we have received from God for ourselves. We have entered a time where in the midst of great hopelessness the Grace of God has the amazing power to set the captives free. We must allow the Holy Spirit to teach us how to release the Grace of God by being willing to listen to His instructions; see with His eyes; have our hearing fine tuned by His power; and seizing every opportunity with joy to release the wonderful Grace of God.
